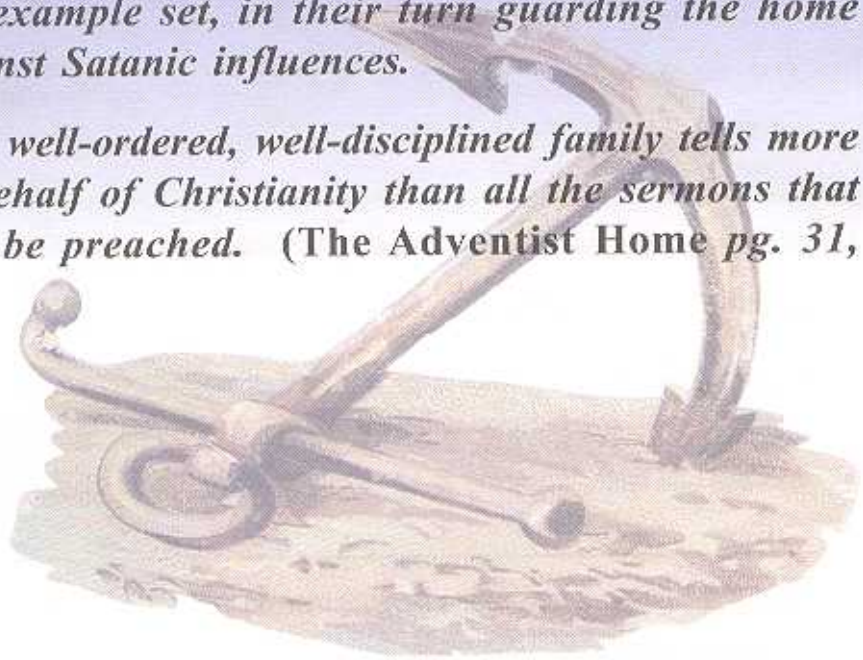


# Anchor of Hope
